We are honored to be hosting our next ISPS conference in **New York City in March of 2015 at Cooper Union**. The last international conference held in the United States was in 1994 in Washington, DC, chaired by David Feinsilver.

Our conference theme underscores the importance of dialogue between the many approaches to helping people with psychosis. World wide there is pervasive stigma around mental illness, resulting in marginalization of all of us who experience, work with, or love people with psychotic disorders. So, although we may disagree vigorously with each other, there is clearly value in coming together and sharing, discussing, and debating the many varieties of experience and work. The conference is structured to give space to differing approaches, **"From DNA to Neighborhood"**.

We will begin on Thursday with the full spectrum - **"From Neurobiology to Person"** Plenary speakers Jeffrey Lieberman, president of the American Psychiatric Association and chair of the Department of Psychiatry of Columbia University, and Deborah Levy, director of Harvard University's Psychology Research Laboratory at McLean Hospital will represent research on the biological and genetic pole. John Strauss, professor emeritus at Yale University's Department of Psychiatry, long time ISPS

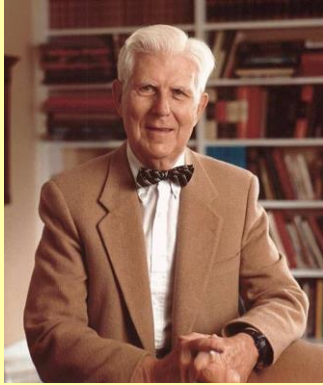

member, and researcher on subjective experience will represent the dimension of the person.

On Friday we move into recent work on the psychosocial approaches, with a theme of "**From Social Exclusion to Social Inclusion**". Our speakers are Jan Olav Johannessen on his work in early intervention in Norway and Lisa Dixon who has brought her depth of work in education and health services research to the Center for Practice Innovations of Columbia University and the New York State Office of Mental Health. (We are enthusiastic about a third speaker, and hope to announce that name shortly).

Saturday brings us closer to Neighborhood - the subjective, lived experience of psychosis, and its value for those working to craft helping approaches. Our theme is "**Phenomenology and Lived Experience in Psychosis: Recovery and the Therapeutic Process**". Plenary speakers are Larry Davidson of Yale and SAMHSA's Recovery to Practice project; Keris Myrick, president of NAMI and service user; and a presentation of recovery by the Norwegian therapist/client team of Silje Marie Strandberg and Lone Viste Fagerland.

We will conclude our conference on Sunday with four plenaries on a range of psychological therapies for psychosis - Ann-Louise Silver on psychodynamic work, Tony Morrison on CBT for psychosis, Mary Olson on Open Dialogue, and Bent Rosenbaum, researcher on psychodynamic supportive therapy.

In addition, as is usual at our ISPS conferences, there will be a wide range of papers, posters, workshops, and symposia from all of you - the ISPS members.

and long reputation for inspiring clinicians, service users, family members, researchers and administrators.

It is the most important meeting place for professionals, users and relatives that consider mental (psychiatric) disorders as dimensional disorders, where the final mental breakdown which we name psychosis, is a reversible condition which is preceded by a state of depression and anxiety, and where our psychological regulatory system don't manage to cope with the emotional distress. And as something that could happen to everyone, given the right amount of stress that hits at the right time at your weak points.

And, the most important meeting place for professionals, patients and relatives who understands that this breakdown, through its' apparently hidden meaningful meanings such as hallucinations (unrealistic perceptual experiences) or delusions (uncorrectable misunderstandings) are important messages to one self and the outer world, from the person within.

We want to work in mental health services of which we can be really proud. Services that acknowledge the person, the self and importance of feelings. Services that make a room and a space for relational understanding of human problems, and for "relational treatment".

Within the ISPS community there is such a breadth of knowledge, experience and skill to be shared and absorbed, that attending an ISPS conference is always regarded as very supportive in transmitting ideas and for improving services.

It is therefore really exciting that the ISPS international conference is returning to the USA after a gap of 21 years and that we are holding the conference in Manhattan. Also, that the US has a central role and responsibility in the fast developing bridge between neurosciences and psychological understanding of human mind and behavior, a bridge that confirms what psychologically oriented theorists and practitioners have stated at all times.

We have the utmost confidence that participants from all over the world and our American colleagues will have a rich conference experience in such an exhilarating city.

Our theme has been very carefully chosen to reflect cutting edge issues, of the interaction between constitution, relationships and social setting and their implications for prevention and amelioration

David B. Feinsilver, M.D. was a long-time staff member at the Chestnut Lodge Hospital in Rockville, Maryland, U.S.A, where he chaired its Symposium Committee. A former president of ISPS, the chair of its 1994 meeting in Washington, and the founder of ISPS-US, he established a fund before he died after a long illness. This fund grants a scholarship to fund travel expenses to each ISPS International congress, for the best research or clinical paper on the psychotherapeutic treatment of the severely disturbed.

Established in 1859, The Cooper Union for the Advancement of Science and Art, is among the oldest and most distinguished institutions of higher education in the United States.

Abstract Submission Guidelines



Follow these easy steps to submit a presentation for ISPS NY 2015

1. Decide on whether you wish to submit a paper, panel/ symposia etc.
2. Select a theme from the suggested list.
3. Prepare a 300 word abstract omitting names for blind review purposes (meet the author is the exception).
4. Prepare Learning Objectives for your submission. Provide 3 learning objectives if a session is shorter than 3

- **Workshops** - 45 minutes to 1 1/2 hours, opportunity for active audience participation and learning
- **Meet the Author** - 30 minutes of discussion of a recently published book
- **Posters** - for presentation of research, projects or programs, or other work on conference themes
