Keynote Speaker Biographies

Alison Brabban qualified as a Clinical Psychologist in 1990 and since then has specialised in Cognitive Behavioural Therapy for Psychosis. She feels passionately that everyone experiencing psychosis should have access to psychological therapies and aims to achieve this ambition in her role as the National Advisor for Psychosis and Bipolar Disorder for the Improving Access to Psychological Therapies programme within NHS England. Alison also works as the lead for Recovery in TEWV (an NHS Trust in the North East of England) and as a clinician in the local Early Intervention in Psychosis service. Alison was part of the UK's Schizophrenia Commission and was also involved in the development of the recent update of the NICE guideline for schizophrenia and psychosis.

Jacqui Dillon is a respected speaker, writer and activist, and has lectured and published worldwide on trauma, psychosis, dissociation and recovery. Jacqui is the national Chair of the Hearing Voices Network in England, Honorary Lecturer in Clinical Psychology at the University of East London, Honorary Research Fellow in the School of Medicine, Pharmacy and Health, Durham University and Visiting Research Fellow at The Centre for Community Mental Health, Birmingham City University. Jacqui is the co-editor of *Living with Voices, an anthology of 50 voice hearers stories of recovery*, *Demedicalising Misery: Psychiatry, Psychology and the Human Condition* and the 2nd Edition of *Models of Madness: Psychological, Social and Biological Approaches to Psychosis*. She has published numerous articles and papers, is on the editorial board of the journal *Psychosis: Psychological, Social and Integrative Approaches* and a foreign correspondent for *Mad in America*. Jacqui is also a voice hearer.

Christopher Dowrick is Professor of Primary Medical Care in the University of Liverpool and a GP in north Liverpool. He is also Professorial Research Fellow in the University of Melbourne, member of the WONCA' working party on mental health and a technical expert for the WHO mhGAP programme. His research portfolio covers common mental health problems in primary care. He critiques contemporary emphases on unitary diagnostic categories and medically-oriented interventions, and highlights the need for socially-oriented perspectives. He is currently investigating equity of access for people from marginalised communities, and exploring the concept of self in primary care encounters.

Gráinne Fadden is a Consultant Clinical Psychologist based in Birmingham and Solihull Mental Health Foundation NHS Trust, Honorary Senior Research Fellow at the University of Birmingham and Director of the Meriden Family Programme. The Programme has trained over 5400 people to work with families and been awarded joint-winner of the National Institute for Mental Health in England (NIMHE) 2003 Positive Practice Award for 'Modernising Mental Health Services', winner of the 'Social Care Award' (Midlands and East Region) in 2005 in the Health and Social Care Awards organised by the Department of Health, and winner of the Health Service Journal national award for Mental Health Innovation in 2008. In November 2009, Dr Fadden was awarded the prestigious Marsh Award which is a lifetime achievement award given by Rethink, the UK national mental health charity, for her outstanding contribution to mental health.

Dr Fadden has worked in the area of family work throughout her career; in clinical practice, research, training and more recently in relation to influencing organisational change to incorporate family work routinely into mental health services. She has also written extensively on the effects of mental health problems on families, the ways in which families can be supported, and on the training of mental health professionals to work with families, including books, book chapters and research articles. She has been involved in a number of EU funded research projects evaluating various aspects of the impact of mental health problems on families, and the development of services to families. Current initiatives being developed include family member peer support and recovery for family members.

Dr Fadden links with the Department of Health, NHS England and Health Education England on issues relating to families and carers, and also works closely with a range of national bodies, including the Royal College of Psychiatrists, regarding these issues. Her international reputation has resulted in her delivering training in Europe and as far afield as Canada, Australia and Japan.

Svein Friis is an emeritus professor of Psychiatry, M.D University of Oslo 1969, Doctor of Medical Science at the University of Oslo 1984, specialist in psychiatry 1976 and supervisor of psychotherapy (Norwegian Medical Association)1991. Psychoanalyst (Norwegian Psychoanalytic Association)1994. Associate professor, University of Bergen for 4 years. Founder of the Department of Research and Education, and Director of Research, Division of Psychiatry, Ullevål University Hospital, and its leader the first 19 years. Professor of psychiatry at the University of Oslo for 25 years, six of which he was Chairman of the Institute of Psychiatry.

Evaluator for the Norwegian Research Council, EU's Biomed Programme and Finnish Academy of Science, and Chairman of the Norwegian Research Councils reference group for an 8-year Evaluation of the Norwegian Government's national plan for improving mental health services.

He was for 6 years member of the Advisory Board and for 12 more years Associate Editor of *Acta Psychiatrica Scandinavica*, for 10 years member of the International Advisory Board, *British Journal of Psychiatry*, and since 2014 he has been Associate Editor of *Schizophrenia Bulletin*.

He has comprehensive experience in evaluation of treatment programs and has used the Ward Atmosphere Scale since 1972 and has been involved in a broad range of clinical research projects, primarily concerning treatment of personality disorders and psychosis. His main investment the latest 20 years has been in the TIPS-study, an international Multi-center study of early intervention in psychosis., From 2003 through 2015 he was co-PI with Thomas McGlashan.

He has received the Honorary Prize of the Schizophrenia Days. Stavanger, Norway, is Knight of the Royal Norwegian St. Olav's Order.

Peter C. Groot is a senior molecular genetic researcher who became a mental health expert by experience. He did molecular genetic research into the genetic susceptibility of complex genetic diseases until he developed a severe depression in 2003. His experience as a patient combined with a background as a researcher and a part-time psychology study led him on a quest for answers about the usefulness of psychiatric diagnoses and the efficacy of psychotropic medications. This resulted in the development of tapering strips for psychotropic medications and a new start as an investigator with lived experience in the field of psychiatry and psychology at the User Research Centre of the Department of Psychiatry and Psychology at Maastricht University Medical Centre, Maastricht.

Lucy Johnstone is a consultant clinical psychologist, author of 'Users and abusers of psychiatry' (2nd edition Routledge 2000) and co-editor of 'Formulation in psychology and psychotherapy: making sense of people's problems' (Routledge, 2nd edition 2013) and 'A straight-talking guide to psychiatric diagnosis' (PCCS Books 2014), along with a number of other chapters and articles taking a critical perspective on mental health theory and practice. She is the former Programme Director of the Bristol Clinical Psychology Doctorate and was the lead author of the 'Good practice guidelines on the use of psychological formulation' (Division of Clinical Psychology, 2011.) She has worked in Adult Mental Health settings for many years, most recently in a service in South Wales. She is currently project lead for an ambitious attempt to outline a conceptual alternative to psychiatric diagnosis. She is an experienced conference speaker, lecturer and trainer.

Kwame McKenzie is CEO of the Wellesley Institute. He is an international expert on the social causes of illness, suicide and the development of effective, equitable health systems. As a physician, researcher and policy advisor, Dr. McKenzie has worked to identify the causes of illness and in cross-cultural health for over two decades. He is an active, funded researcher of social, community, clinical and policy issues with nearly 200 academic publications including five books.

In addition to his post at Wellesley Institute, Dr. McKenzie is Medical Director responsible Health Equity at CAMH. He is a full Professor and the Co-Director of the Division of Equity Gender and Population in the Department of Psychiatry, University of Toronto.

Dr. McKenzie sits on the Boards of the United Way Toronto and the Ontario Hospitals Association. He is a Senior Fellow at Massey College.

Dr. McKenzie is a member of the Ontario Government's Mental Health and Addictions Leadership Advisory Council and sat on the Expert Advisory Group for Ontario's Homelessness Strategy along side numerous other committees. He has a respected track record for setting up award winning services, training clinicians and researchers, offering clinical care to some of the most marginalized patients, and helping to develop health policy for Governments in Canada, Africa, Europe, the Caribbean and United States.

Dr. McKenzie completed his medical training at the University of Southampton and was trained in psychiatry at the Maudsley Hospital and Institute of Psychiatry and Harvard University

Shelagh Musgrave cares for, and advocates for, her daughter who has a history of complex mental health issues. Shelagh is passionate about improving carer engagement. Her own experiences have led her to believe that it is essential for professionals to consider the impact of the mental ill health of a loved one on the primary carer and the wider family network, and to actively seek their input and value their knowledge in order to create supportive working partnerships that will better support the service user.

Shelagh works in the U.K. with Birmingham & Solihull Mental Health NHS Foundation Trust (BSMHFT), currently on a voluntary basis, as an advocate for carers. She is Carer Co-chair on the Recovery Programme Committee and Carer Experience Lead for the newly formed project team responsible for the Families & Carers Pathway Project. This is a 3-year project to design and implement this new pathway, which will train mental health professionals to work proactively with carers and families from the outset. During May 2017, she is attending Agents of Change, an intensive 3-day training programme delivered by Health Education England. This leadership programme is designed to develop presentation and speaking skills for those willing to share their stories and messages of change, in order to influence the NHS.

Organisational change is challenging, but Shelagh is excited to be involved and feels strongly that through lived experience, she can help to influence the decision making as BSMHFT designs and rolls out the new Families & Carers Pathway Project. She hopes, as a consequence, that the future for carers and families in BSMHFT is one in which they will feel recognised and respected as expert care partners; where they are encouraged to consider the impact caring has on their own health & wellbeing and where they are supported in identifying what will best help them to achieve balance between staying well and healthy themselves whilst at the same time being able to care for their loved one.

Jim van Os is Professor and Chairman of the Department of Psychiatry and Psychology at Maastricht University Medical Centre, Maastricht, The Netherlands, and Visiting Professor of Psychiatric Epidemiology at the Institute of Psychiatry, London, UK. He trained in Psychiatry in Casablanca (Morocco), Bordeaux (France) and finally at the Institute of Psychiatry and the Maudsley/Bethlem Royal Hospital in London (UK) and after his clinical training was awarded a three-year UK Medical Research Council Training Fellowship in Clinical Epidemiology at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine. In 1995, he moved to Maastricht University Medical Centre.

He created the first User Research Centre in continental Europe (<https://urc.mumc.maastrichtuniversity.nl/>), where users of mental health services create solutions to deal with stigma, tapering psychotropic medications and empower people with lived experiences working in mental health services.

In 2015, together with colleagues Philippe Delespaul and Wilma Boevink, he initiated psychiatric reform in the Netherlands, resulting in pilots of 'novel mental health services' throughout the Netherlands, based on the creation of caring communities both locally and online.

In 2011, he was elected member of the *Royal Netherlands Academy of Arts and Sciences* (KNAW); he appears on the 2014/2015 Thomson-Reuter *Web of Science* list of the world's 'most influential scientific minds' of our time.

David Shiers is an Honorary Reader in Early Psychosis in Manchester University, a former GP in N.Staffordshire and father to a daughter with schizophrenia. From initial complaints about his daughter's care in the late 90s, David embraced *Early Intervention in Psychosis* reform to avoid other families experiencing what his had. David led with Jo Smith the UK's National Early Intervention in Psychosis Programme (2004-10). David's current interest is in questioning why poor physical health should be inevitable for people like his daughter, participating in relevant NICE guidance and quality standards, and as clinical advisor to two National Audits of Schizophrenia (2011-15).

Jon Vidar Strømstad is a psychiatric nurse and assistant ward leader. He has also been working with WAS since 2009. He is an experienced clinician and places himself in a psychodynamic tradition of 'relational treatment'.

Anne Berit Eie Torbjørnsen is a psychiatric nurse. She has been working with the Ward Atmosphere Scale (WAS) since 2009. As a head nurse she has been focused on the perspective of professional leadership and how it affects the therapeutic milieu in psychiatric wards.

Rachel (Rai) Waddingham is an experienced international trainer who specialises in innovative ways of supporting people who struggle with extreme states (including 'psychosis', 'dissociation' and complex post-traumatic reactions). Rai has particular expertise in working with children, young people and people in prison who hear voices. In 2010, Rai launched a project developing a network of Hearing Voices peer support groups in London's prisons, building on her work developing group for adults and young people in the community.

Rai is a trustee of the English Hearing Voices Network, Chair of Intervoice and Vice Chair of ISPS UK. She is also a member of the ISPS International Executive Committee. Rai has personal experience of hearing voices, psychosis and hospitalisation. She uses her own experiences and the principles of the Hearing Voices Movement to inform her work.

ISPS Liverpool Declaration

This conference is driven by our belief that fundamental changes are needed if people who experience psychosis are to have their psychological and social care needs met adequately. The following statement, our 'Liverpool Declaration' sets out our beliefs about the kind of changes that are needed. Individuals who would like to express support, **please pledge support at www.isps.org**

We share a number of core principles and positions:

The nature of psychosis: We believe that the current paradigm in understanding the causes and nature of psychosis focuses too much on biological perspectives and not enough on social and psychological perspectives. Social and psychological experiences continue to be viewed as simply 'triggering' underlying disease processes, a perspective no longer supported by research. We believe that the time has come to reverse the balance – which we believe will lead to a fuller and more accurate understanding of these conditions. A more accurate understanding of the causes and nature of psychosis will be found by emphasizing psychological and social perspectives, while not ignoring biological perspectives.

The treatment of psychosis: We believe that the preferred treatment of psychosis should be social and psychological interventions, with biological interventions (including medications) used sparingly. There is now strong evidence for the efficacy of non-medical interventions, which should always be a part of every treatment plan for a person diagnosed with a psychotic disorder.

Prevention of psychosis: We believe that the most efficient and cost-effective means of reducing or preventing psychosis would be to develop programs to help families and societies raise their young children, to minimize the adverse experiences that are now clearly related to the development of psychosis.

The role of the person diagnosed: We believe that individuals diagnosed with psychotic disorders (or any other mental disorder) are no less a person and no less deserving of respect than those not given a diagnosis. They, and their family (if supportive), must be as involved as much as possible in decisions about their treatment. Collaboration should be the hallmark of any approach, and persons should be offered as much choice as possible about how best to deal with the problems they are experiencing.

Political and social action: On the basis of these positions, we commit to advocate for more social and psychological approaches to the psychoses, and to increasing the public and professional understanding of psychosis as being largely a response to life experiences. We commit to advocate to government agencies for this to happen, to support research consistent with this perspective, and to use media and respond to media stories when appropriate. We support the increasing expectation of at least parity with physical health in the provision of resources for mental health disorders and for research. Resources for psychosocial interventions should be proportionate to the evidence base for their effectiveness.

We hope that the implementation of these principles could lead to a paradigm shift in the treatment and understanding of those among us who experience psychotic symptoms or who are diagnosed with psychotic disorders.
